## False prophets, true prophets

In Deuteronomy today we hear that God's very words will fill the mouth of a true prophet, but a false prophet will, in a manner of speaking, put mere mortal words into God's mouth. In Mark's Gospel, we see Jesus teaching and healing as a true prophet, one filled with the authority of God's own voice, the Holy One of God.

The whole history of our church is filled with both true and false prophets. But in today's Gospel we learn that Jesus' fame spread because he taught with authority; he wasn't an authority because he was popular or famous. We also learn from him, in his desert temptation confrontations with Satan, that anyone can quote scripture, even against God's purposes. And today we hear that his authority was not like that of the scribes, who held the official positions of religious authority in his day. Our work is to do our best to discern the true prophets in our midst, and to be true prophets as well. The psalmist tells us how to do this: by not hardening our hearts when God speaks. If we truly listen to God, it will be God's very words filling our mouths.

STM Senior Ministry is one of the most active and well-rounded ministries, focusing on service, fellowship and prayer. They seek to strengthen the feeling of community for parishioners ages 55 and older through planned activities which take place throughout the entire year. These include days of reflection, bus trips to regional churches, towns and exhibits, cooking for and serving meals to LSU students, Habitat for Humanity volunteers, and much more. So if you are 55 and older, you are invited to be part of the Senior Ministry and celebrate the joy of faith, fellowship and fun!

The Single Seniors Ministry is for men and women who have never married or have lost a spouse through death, divorce or separation. They provide spiritual, emotional and mental support through a variety of spiritual and social activities including dinners and fun activities. Their mission is to help any member with meals, doctor appointments, hospital or homebound stays or errands. A project dear to their hearts is the "adoption" of a middle aged nursing home resident who is confined to her bed. They began by purchasing her a television set four years ago and have continued their outreach by paying for her cable service, visiting with her weekly, and buying her Christmas and birthday presents. ## Celebrate Life: Marching for Life

The summit of Right to Life month is the **March for Life** which takes place annually in Washington D.C. The March was first held on January 22, 1974 led by grassroots pro-life leaders who wanted to make sure the 1<sup>st</sup> anniversary of the legalization of abortion was remembered and that petitions were sent to Congress to readdress this law. According to the official March for Life website, "No established right-to-life organization was prepared to undertake the planning, financial and operational responsibilities for a high impact pro-life March on the U.S. Capitol. But, grassroots proliferators wanted to march." And march they did. The first March for Life was held on the West Steps of the Capitol. An estimated 20,000 committed pro-life Americans rallied that day.

Since then the number of participants has grown from 20,000 to 200,000. This year within the Diocese of Baton Rouge 11 buses with adults and teenagers attended. That's over 500 people. In addition various other groups and individuals also made the journey including many from St. Thomas More. Those who were unable to travel the distance to Washington D.C., joined the Louisiana Life March which traveled through downtown Baton Rouge, and culminated at the steps of the Louisiana State Capitol building. Various political leaders and pro-life organizers spoke in support of Life.

But why march? We are called to be the voice of those who have none. John Paul II explains in the *Gospel of Life*, "To be truly a people at the service of life we must propose these truths constantly and courageously from the very first proclamation of the Gospel, and thereafter in catechesis, in the various forms of preaching, in personal dialogue and in all educational activity. We shall find important points of contact and dialogue also with non-believers, in our common commitment to the establishment of a new culture of life." We are responsible for spreading the Good News in any and every venue. From the classrooms, to the churches, to the shopping malls and in this case, to Capitol Hill; our role as Catholic Christians is to be the voice of life for those being destroyed, forgotten or abandoned. And further, we join forces with other faiths, both Christian and non-Christian to promote the dignity and uphold the rights of humanity. We are the hands and feet of Christ. We uphold His mission. This is why we march.

### St. Padre Pio Prayer Group

Why is it important to have Catholic spiritual prayer groups? Through Catholic spiritual prayer groups there is a mutual understanding and an acceptance of community of believers without words. It is something that is deep in our hearts to believe in the same faith and the same traditions, knowing the truth of Jesus in our lives while carrying on the history of our beliefs to others. It transforms us into the faithful servants of God and enables us to give thanks and glorify God for our many blessings.

Padre Pio was a most worthy follower of St. Francis. Both St. Francis and Padre Pio bore the stigmata. Saint Francis bore the stigmata for three years; Padre Pio for fifty years! He constantly offered himself for the intentions of the Pope and especially for the conversion of sinners and peace in the world. He did not want for himself the treasures of grace that God showered upon him with singular generosity; therefore in his sacred ministry he unceasingly served the men and women who came to him and he generated an immense multitude of spiritual sons and daughters. On the spiritual level he founded the prayer groups, which he himself described as "reservoirs of faith and...furnaces of love," and the Sovereign Pontiff had described as "a great river of persons who pray." Pope Paul VI states, "Padre Pio has founded this great company, this river of persons who pray and who, following his example and in the hope of his spiritual help, dedicate themselves to the Christian life and give witness of communion in prayer, in charity, in poverty of spirit and in the dynamism of the Christian profession...little cells of ecclesial life...that diffuse in our world, permeated with materialistic personalism, the vivifying oxygen of the spiritual heights" – that God is in our lives. (Gennaro Prezioso, The Life of Padre Pio) God bless your family!




