Changes to Profession of Faith

For the last several weeks, we have been reviewing the texts of the new translation of the Mass that we will begin using in Advent. This week we will review the changes in our Profession of Faith or Creed. The words that we will use to profess our faith will change, but our faith will stay the same.

The Creed that we normally proclaim on Sunday is the Nicene Creed that dates back to the Council of Nicea in 325 AD. The changes in the new translation will more accurately reflect the original Latin and express our common faith with more precision.

You will notice right away that the Creed begins with "I BELIEVE" instead of "We believe." This is a literal translation of the Latin word, "Credo" from which we get the word "Creed." While the Creed is still the faith of the entire Church, each one of us must proclaim it as our own together with other believers. Therefore, it is important to say the words, "I BELIEVE" together with the priest, and not after he has begun the Creed.

The next change you will notice is at the end of the first paragraph with the words, "OF ALL THINGS VISIBLE AND INVISIBLE" which replaces the old translation "seen and unseen."

In the second line of the next paragraph, we again see the words, "ONLY BEGOTTEN SON" that we saw in the new text of the Gloria. These words again emphasize the Father's intentional begetting of Jesus as part of a Divine Plan.

The next line reads, "BORN OF THE FATHER BEFORE ALL AGES." This reflects our belief that Jesus dwelled with the Father before time began and echoes the meaning of the opening words of St. John's Gospel, "in the beginning was the Word."

In the second to last line of the second paragraph, we see the phrase, "CONSUBSTANTIAL WITH THE FATHER." The word consubstantial is an almost literal transcription of the Latin word, *consubstantialis*, which means "having the same substance." It is an unusual word, but it comes down to us from the ancient Church and represents an extremely important element of our faith, namely, our belief that Jesus "has the same substance" as God the Father. In other words, Jesus Christ is Divine.

Another unusual word appears in the second line of the third paragraph which says, "BY THE HOLY SPIRIT WAS INCARNATE OF THE VIRGIN MARY." The word "incarnate" means, "given flesh." It replaces the word "born" in our current translation and emphasizes that Jesus was "given flesh" from the moment of conception in the womb of Mary, not simply when He was born.

At the end of the first line of the fourth paragraph we see the words, "HE SUFFERED DEATH." This replaces the two verbs, "suffered and died" in our current translation. The new wording emphasizes that Jesus really died, which gives the Resurrection its full meaning.

In the second line of the last paragraph, the phrase, "I CONFESS..." replaces the phrase, "We acknowledge" in our current translation. In this context, the word "CONFESS" means to "profess belief in," not "to express sorrow for sins." It is stronger than "acknowledge" because it involves the heart, not just the head.

Finally, at the end of the Creed, instead of saying, "We look for the Resurrection," we will now say, "I LOOK FORWARD TO THE RESURRECTION." This phrase conveys a much more confident tone about our belief in new life.

The Creed is a summary of all of the important beliefs of our faith. We are proud to profess it.

Mark's Jesus

Mark's Gospel is the shortest and tersest of all four. The discourses of Jesus tend to be terser as well. Mark's portrayal of Jesus has none of the poetry of the Sermon on the Mount or the Sermon on the Plain as in Matthew or Luke, nor the extensive, reflective "I Am" discourses as in John. Mark's Jesus "cuts to the chase," we would say today. This is reflected quite well in today's passage.

It is no accident that the dialogue of Jesus at this point in the Gospel according to Mark—the concluding words about the end of the world—immediately before his passion, is riddled with exclamation points and an overall sense of urgency.

We would do well to re-tool our own way of living this Advent, for we live in a world urgently in need of hearing the message of Jesus proclaimed. It's time for us to "wake up!" and get out into the world to do it.

A VOCATION VIEW

The season of Advent calls us to be vigilant in anticipation of the Master's return so that we live each day according to the teachings of Christ. Some are called to teach, preach and witness those teachings as priests and religious. God may be calling you to a Church vocation.
